- ·Images must not include a watermark or border
- •The photograph must not, in the sole and unfettered discretion of the organisers, contain obscene, defamatory, sexually explicit or otherwise inappropriate content. Photographs deemed inappropriate will be disqualified.
- •Please keep digital manipulation such as cloning and compositing to a minimum; your photograph should faithfully represent the scene/subject as you saw it.
- •By entering this competition, you grant Church on the Corner a non-exclusive licence to display your photograph in connection with this contest in a gallery at Church on the Corner on 22nd and 23rd October 2009 and in publicity relating to the event.

- •Alternatively please feel free to deliver your entry in person the church is open every Sunday from 6:30 8:30 p.m. A box will be left in the foyer for entries. Please note **church will NOT be open on Sunday 18th October.**
- •The deadline for entry is by midnight on Sunday 18th October 2009

Judging and Prizes:

- •A prize of £250 will be awarded, plus the framing of your picture up to the value of £100 at **'The Only Place For Pictures'** (216 Upper Street)
- •The pictures will be displayed in a gallery at Church on the Corner on the evenings of 22nd and 23rd October. During this time, visitors to the gallery will be asked to nominate their favourite picture.
- •The judges will view the pictures in the gallery on Friday 23rd October. They will judge by the following criteria:

- •Scoring will be on the basis of 10 marks: three (3) for technical merit, three (3) for composition and four (4) for interpretation of theme. Based on these criteria, each judge is free to give a total score from 1 to 10.
- •The winner will be the picture with the greatest aggregate number of marks as awarded by the judging panel.
- •In the event of a draw, the public votes will be added to decide the winner.
- •If this still results in a draw, the chairman of the judging panel will choose an overall winner.
- •The judging panel's decision will be final.
